## INSTALLATION


- 1. Installation of speaker
  - a) Connect speaker cable to speaker jack of main unit.
  - b) The wire with black stripe should connect to black terminal of the speaker jack.
  - c) The speaker stand can be set up with 2 directions.
- 2. Make sure the power cord is securely firmed into the AC outlet.
- 3. Remove the insulated plate in the backup battery compartment.
- 4. Wall mounting remove the stands from the main unit and both speakers.




Insert speaker stand to the bottom of speaker box




Remove insulated plate before use (remote control)




Insert main unit stand to the rear of main unit




Two directions of the speaker



- 1. POWER button turn on / off the unit
- 2. SLEEP button control period of power off
- 3. RADIO / BAND button power on radio or select radio band
- 4. CHANNEL button select radio preset station
- 5. **MEMÓRY / PROGRAM** button save radio preset station / enter CD program mode / save setting
- 6. MODE button enter setting mode
- 7. ALM ON/OFF turn on/off the alarm
- 8. **SNOOZE / LIGHT** button enter snooze mode / turn on display backlight / exit the setting mode


## REMOTE CONTROL

- 1. **POWER** button turn on / off the unit
- 2. SLEEP button control period of power off
- 3. OPEN button open / close the CD door
- 4. **CD PLAY PAUSE** button to play / to pause / resume CD playback / turn on CD playback
- 5. STOP button to stop CD playback / turn off the CD playback
- 6. (I◀◀ ▶►I) button CD searching
- 7. + VOL- button adjust volume level up or down
- 8. RADIO button turn on the radio
- 9. BAND button select radio band
- 10. PRESET+/- button select the preset radio channel
- 11. MUTE button mute volume of the unit

## LISTENING TO RADIO

## EXTERNAL ANTENNA

Use a screwdriver to attach the antenna to the connector at the back of the unit. Reception quality relies on the length of the antenna from the base of the unit to the floor. The greater the distance, the stronger the reception quality.



#### **RADIO OPERATION**

- 1. Press the RADIO / BAND button to activate the radio.
- 2. If necessary press the **RADIO** / **BAND** button again to select AM or FM band.
- 3. Press the **TUNING** ◀ or ▶ buttons to tune to desired station.

#### • Automatic Tuning :

Press and hold the **TUNING** ◀ or ▶ buttons until the display starts to scan, and then release the button.

The Tuner will stop on the first strong station it finds.

Repeat this procedure until the desired frequency appears in the display.

#### Manual Tuning :

Repeatedly press the **TUNING**  $\blacktriangleleft \blacktriangleleft$  or  $\blacktriangleright \blacktriangleright$  buttons to manually move the display up or down until you reach the frequency of the desired station.

#### **NOTES:**

- A. Use manual tuning to select weaker stations that might be bypassed during automatic tuning.
- B. If the automatic tuning does not stop on the exact frequency of the station, for example it stops on 100.85 MHz instead of 100.8 MHz, use the manual tuning method to "fine tune" to the exact frequency of the desired station.

#### PRESET RADIO STATIONS

The unit allows you to store up to 10 AM and 10 FM stations in the tuner preset memories for easy recall at any time.

- 1. Press the RADIO / BAND button to activate the radio.
- 2. If necessary press the **RADIO** / **BAND** button again to select AM or FM band.
- 3. Tune to desired radio station using ◀◀ or ▶▶ buttons.
- 4. Press the memory **MEM / PGM** button once, preset channel number 01 will appear on display.
- 5. Use CH+ or CH- buttons to select desired preset channel number.
- 6. Press MEM / PGM button again to confirm storage of setting.

#### 9k / 10kHz SETTING


In case the unit is moved to different country with slightly different AM (MW) broadcast system, the unit allows you to select either 9kHz or 10kHz per tuning step.

- 1. Press MODE button 7 times.
- 3. Press MEM / PGM button to store setting.

## LISTENING TO CD

#### LOADING A CD

- 1. Press the **POWER** button.
- 2. Touch the **OPEN** button, the CD door will open automatically.
- 3. Put a CD, printed side facing down, on the CD door as diagram shown.
- 4. Touch the **OPEN** button to close the CD door.



#### PLAYBACK CD

- 1. Press PLAY / PAUSE button to start playback.
- 2. Adjust the sound level using **VOLUME** button.

#### PAUSE CD

- 1. Press **PLAY / PAUSE** button pause / resume CD playback.
- 2. Press STOP button to stop CD playback.
- 3. Press STOP button again to turn off the unit.

#### SKIP / SEARCH FUNCTION

Press ◀◀ or ▶▶ to skip to desired CD track. Press and hold ◀◀ or ▶▶ for backward or forward search.

#### **PLAY MODE**

- a) Repeat Play:
  - Press **PLAY MODE** button once. " " will appear for repeat playback of one track. Press **PLAY MODE** button twice, " (ALL )" will appear for repeat playback of the whole disc.
- b) Intro Play, playback the 1st 10 seconds of each track of the disc: Press **PLAY MODE** button three times, then "INTRO" IS DISPLAYED. Press **PLAY/PAUSE** button, then starts INTRO play from track number 1.
- c) Random Play:
- Press **PLAY MODE** button four times, then "**RND**" is displayed. Press **PLAY/PAUSE** button, then the track number is selected at random and starts playback.

#### PROGRAM PLAYBACK

This feature allows you to program tracks that you would like to hear them (up to total 20 tracks for each disc).

- 1. When CD stop playback, press MEM / PGM button once. " PGM " and " 00 " (track number) indicators on display flash.
- 2. Press ◀ or ▶ button to select track number.

3. When desired track number is displayed, press **MEM / PGM** button to register. Track number " 00 " indicator flashes on display again.

4. Repeat steps (2) & (3) above until all desired (or up to 20) tracks had been

entered.

5. Press **PLAY / PAUSE** ( ▶ II ) button. " PGM " indicator stops flashing and CD starts program playback.

#### NOTE:

If you press the ◀◀ and ▶▶ buttons during programmed playback, the unit will skip forward to the next track in the program, not necessary the next track on the disc.

- a) PGM repeat 1 track:
  During PGM playback, press **PLAY MODE** button once.
  Unit will repeatedly playback current PGM track, " PGM " & " 1" " indicators displayed.
- b) Repeat playback ALL programmed track(s):
  During PGM playback, press **PLAY MODE** button twice.
  Unit will repeatedly playback all programmed tracks, " PGM " & " (ALL )" indicators displayed.
- c) Playback INTRO of programmed track(s): During PGM playback, press PLAY MODE button 3 times, "INTRO" indicator flashes. Press PLAY / PAUSE (► II) button playback the 1st 10 seconds of each programmed track, "PGM" & "INTRO" indicators displayed.

To cancel Playback / all Repeat modes at any time simply press the **STOP** (■ ) buttoon.

## CLOCK SETTING

#### **SETTING TIME**

1. Press MODE button 3 times, the display will flash.

2. Press button ◀◀ or ▶▶ to set advance or reverse the hour.

- 3. Press button VOL- or VOL+ to set advance or reverse the minute.
- 4. Press MODE button again to enter 12/24 hour format setting.

5. Use ◀◀ ▶▶ to select 12 or 24 hour format.

5. Press **MEM / PGM** button to save entries or just wait for around 15 seconds to exit setting mode.

#### SETTING YEAR & TEMPERATURE

- 1. Press MODE button 5 times, the year & temp display will flash.
- 2. Press button ◀◀ or ▶▶ to set advance or reverse the year.
- 3. Press button VOL- or VOL+ to select temperature unit °C or °F.
- 4. Press **MEM / PGM** button to save entries or just wait for around 15 seconds to exit setting mode.

#### SETTING MONTH & DATE

- 1. Press MODE button 6 times, the month / date display will flash.
- 2. Press button ◀◀ or ▶▶ to set advance or reverse the month.
- 3. Press button VOL- or VOL+ to set advance or reverse the date.
- 4. Press **MEM / PGM** button to save entries or just wait for around 15 seconds to exit setting mode.

## ALARM CLOCK SETTING

#### **SETTING ALARM**

- 1. Press MODE button once, and the display will flash.
- 2. Press button ◀ or ▶ to advance or reverse the hour.
- 3. Press button VOL- or VOL+ to set advance or reverse the minute.
- 4. Press MODE button again and the alarm sound icon will flash.
- 5. Press **VOL-** or **VOL+** to select the alarm sound, source(BUZZER, RADIO or CD).

When alarm to CD is selected, use ◀ or ▶ buttons to select desired CD alarm track.

NOTE: Make sure a CD is loaded in the unit.

- 6. Press **MEM / PGM** button to save entries or just wait for around 15 seconds to exit setting mode.
- 7. Press the **ALM ON/OFF** button to switch on the daily alarm, a " > " icon will appear on the display.

#### ALARM TO BUZZER

- An increasingly louder buzzer sound will alarm for one minute.
- After the first alarm minute, it goes into Auto Snooze mode. It stops for around 9 minutes and then comes on again. This operation will be repeated 3 times. After the fourth time the alarm shuts off until the next day.
- You may also activate the Snooze function manually after the alarm sounds by pressing the SNOOZE button or SNZ button on the remote control.

The buzzer stops for around 9 minutes and then comes on again This operation can be repeated 3 times. After the fourth time the alarm shuts off until the next day.

• After the buzzer sounds you may also press the ALM ON / OFF button to stop it immediately. It will reset itself for the following day.

#### ALARM TO RADIO

- At the desired wake up time the radio turns "ON". It starts softly and gradually becomes louder.
- It will play for 15 minutes and then shuts off and resets itself for the following day.
- Within the first TWO minutes you may press the SNOOZE button or SNZ button on the remote control to activate the snooze function. The radio stops for around 9 minutes and then turns "ON" again. This manual snooze operation may be repeated a total of 3 times. Each time the radio turns "ON", it will play for 15 minutes (without pressing the SNOOZE button).
- After the radio sounds you may also press the ALM ON / OFF button to stop it immediately.
   It will reset itself for the following day.

#### ALARM TO CD

- At the desired wake up time the CD playback. It starts softly and gradually becomes louder.
- It will playback for 15 minutes (or up to end of the disc, depends on which one comes first) and then shuts off and resets itself for the following day.
- Within the 1st TWO minutes you may press the SNOOZE button or SNZ button on the remote control to activate the snooze function. The CD stops for around 9 minutes and then turns "ON" again. This manual snooze operation may be repeated a total of 3 times.

During the CD playback you may also press the ALM ON / OFF button to stop it immediately.
It will reset itself for the following day.

## SLEEP TIMER OPERATION

You can use the Sleep Timer to shut the system off automatically while you fall asleep to the radio or the CD player.

- 1. Press **POWER** button to turn on the unit.
- 2. Load the desired CD in the player or tune to the desired radio station.
- 3. Press **SLEEP** button 1, 2, 3 or 4 times to select 15, 30, 45 or 60 minutes of Sleep Timer operation.

  The unit will play for the amount of time you selected and then shuts " off " automatically.

If a desired radio station had been tuned or the desired CD is loaded in the player and the unit is in power "OFF" mode.

You can just simply press the **SLEEP** button to activate the Sleep Timer of the unit.

4. To shut the unit " OFF " sooner press the **POWER** button at any time.

#### NOTE:

If you choose "Sleep to CD" function the unit will only continue until the end of the disc and then shuts "OFF" automatically. For example, if your disc is only 30 minutes long and 45 minutes of sleep time selected, the unit will shut off approximately 30 seconds after the disc ends.

## CARE AND MAINTENANCE

#### RESET BUTTON:

If the unit is subjected to a severe power surge or electric shock, it is possible that the internal microcontroller may " **LOCK UP** " and the unit will not respond to any commands from the front panel controls or remote control. — 16—

1. Plug the AC power cord into AC outlet.

2. Using a straightened paper clip, toothpick, or similar object press **RESET** button located inside the pinhole at the rear side of the unit.

Caution : DO NOT use a sharp end object to press the RESET


button, it may damage the reset switch inside the unit.
